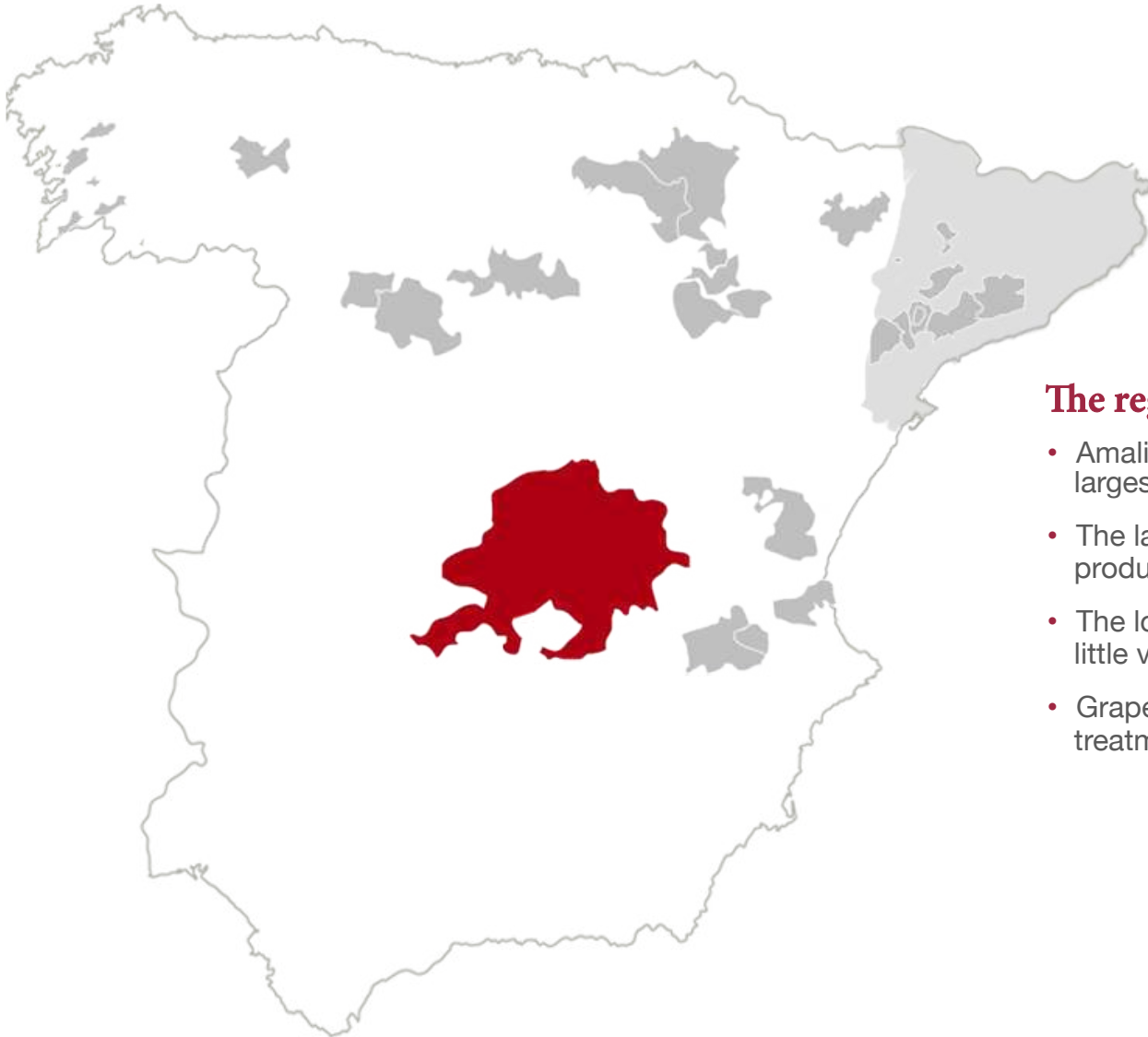
Stylish premium sparkling wine; tank fermented like Prosecco

- A genuinely new and exciting category.
- The Spanish equivalent of Italy's Prosecco (Charmat method/Cuve close).
- Premium blend of Airen, Verdejo and Sauvignon blanc.
- Winery stores must all year round to ensure freshness.
- Bubbles are created naturally through a second fermentation in tank.



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The region

- Amalia is produced for Long Wines in La Mancha, the world's largest area of land under vineyard
- The large scale of vine-growing and mechanisation makes production here very cost-effective and efficient
- The long sunshine hours and low rainfall means that there is little vintage variability and low disease pressure
- Grapes are ripe and healthy with the minimum of chemical treatments

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Brut

- 80% Airen, 15% Verdejo and 5% Sauvignon Blanc.
- Pale lemon yellow with consistent bubbles.
- Aromas of peach, apple, grapefruit and Mediterranean herbs.
- Exhilarating freshness, pure, clean, fruity sparkling wine for easy drinking.
- 12g/l residual sugar, easy to drink but serious enough for the dry sparkling wine drinker (dosage can be adjusted to particular market needs).

Awards

- Silver – AWC Vienna 2020

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Where it comes from

- The winery owns and manages over 1,000 ha of vineyard across La Mancha with an average density of 2,778 plants/hectare
- The vines are planted at an average altitude of 742m, which along with the large diurnal range in temperatures, helps to retain acidity in the grapes
- The conditions are perfect for growing healthy grapes: 3,000 hours of sunlight per year and 400ml of precipitation
- The soil is primarily calcareous clay
- The vineyards are managed sustainability, with a computerised monitoring system, reservoir for irrigation in summer months and solar plant

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Where it is made

- Family-run winery founded in 1853 and long time partner of Long Wines
- Cutting-edge facilities including room cooled to 0°C, another with aseptic tanks and an intelligent warehouse
- Large-scale capacity, the winery can store up to 150 million litres and produce 20,000 bottles/hour across three production lines
- BRC and IFS certified and a member of SEDEX guaranteeing the application of ethical and responsible practices.

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The winemaker

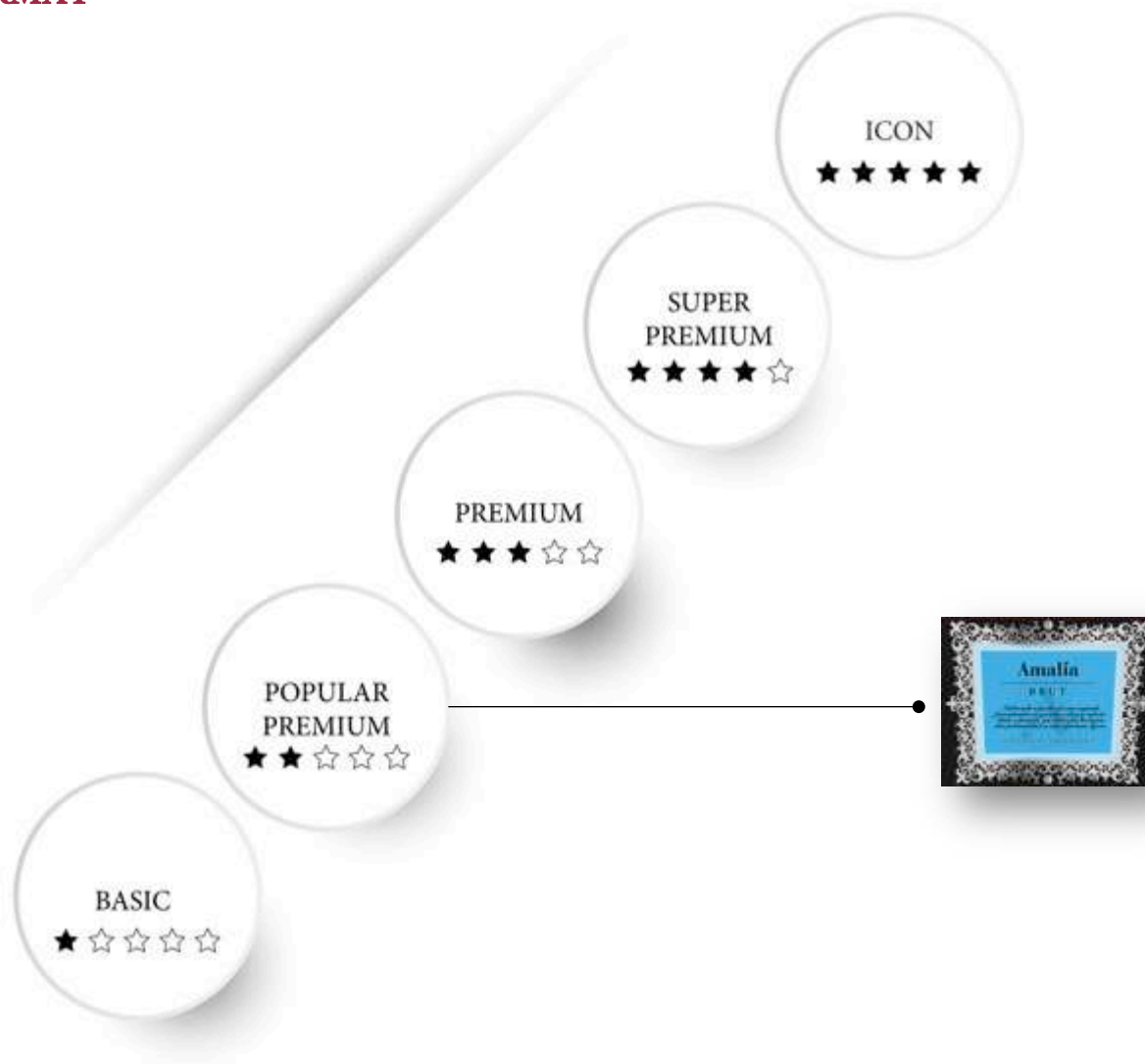
